Property Development

3432 Juniata

A vacant single-family home at 3432
Juniata came to DeSales' attention thanks to the action of nearby neighbors, who had become frustrated by years of inaction on the property. Vacant for over a decade, the property had become a danger to the neighborhood. In 2019, DeSales was able to purchase the property from the owner. DeSales did a substantial clean-up of the property and sold it to a couple who intended to complete a full renovation and live there. They completed their renovation and moved in in 2020. Today, 3432 Juniata is home to our new neighbors.

The Rung for Women Facility

Another substantial success was the completion of the Rung for Women facility on Sidney. We were not responsible for the development, however, our role in acquiring the building from the previous owners and finding the right buyer in Rung was essential to making that project a success.



Senior Housing in Benton Park West

In 2020, we continued to work on our planned senior housing development in Benton Park West, with hopes of receiving a LIHTC award in 2021. If the LIHTC award comes through this year, we are expected to break ground in 2022.

In 2020, Fox Grove Management prioritized projects to streamline operations. Standardizing office procedures and introducing new technologies created efficiencies in day-to-day activities. During the pandemic, Fox Grove suspended late fees, complied with the eviction moratorium, implemented office safety precautions, and sought rental assistance for tenants. Despite the challenges of COVID-19, our diligent managers successfully maintained collections, surpassing that of the previous year.

RENTCafe Resident Portal

When the pandemic began, Fox Grove accelerated the roll-out of RENTCafé Resident Portal across 33 properties. By April, residents could pay rent, manage their account and submit maintenance requests online. RENTCafe was a vital piece in maintaining operations and customer service while limiting health risks to residents and staff during COVID-19.

Addressing COVID-19

Proactive Outreach

At the onset of the pandemic, DeSales and Fox Grove Management immediately took measures to protect staff and residents by making as many functions as possible remote.



Continuous outreach helped to assess the COVID related needs of Fox Grove residents and our neighbors in the DeSales service area. When a resident expressed a need, we did rapid referrals to community partners and helped people navigate applying for unemployment, connecting to expanded benefits, and receiving

stimulus checks. Site Managers held resource drives and found new ways to work with their residents when walk-in appointments were no longer possible.

Our team of AmeriCorps VISTAs organized food drives in early May and throughout June and July to collect and distribute food to neighborhood families experiencing food insecurity.

Rental Assistance

DeSales and Fox Grove Management staff have been very aggressive in pursuing rental relief on behalf of residents. We worked with social service agencies and partnered with our partner nonprofits Red Dough, Prosperity Connection, and St. Louis Community Credit unions to connect residents to significant rental assistance.

Supporting residents in a time of need

On an early morning in September of 2020, a tragic fire destroyed the homes of five families living in apartments managed by Fox Grove Management. The families were able to alert each other and escape the building safely, but they lost nearly all of their belongings. Against the backdrop of a pandemic, this devastating event threw their lives into disarray.

Immediately, Fox Grove staff found nearby apartments for the families while DeSales Community Service Coordination staff learned what else could be helpful. By collaborating with a deep network of community partners, staff were able to fully furnish the new apartments with furniture from partner agency Home Sweet Home, secure funding for food and essential items, and connect affected individuals to mental health experts. DeSales organized a fundraiser with matching funds from St. Louis Equity Fund to assist the families directly with the immense financial need they were suddenly faced with.

Although none of this made up for the tragic loss these families endured, DeSales and Fox Grove responded with support when a crisis turned the lives of our residents upside-down. We are extremely grateful for the overwhelming support our community and partners showed our families.

Community Based Service Coordination

Here To Stay

DeSales' "Here To Stay" 3-month Eviction Prevention Program gives our Fox Grove Management residents an alternative to eviction, offers supportive services and connects residents to financial coaching to catch up on rent. Participating families reduced their rental debt by an average of \$1,760 and achieved wide-ranging personal goals.

Angela's Story

Angela joined the Here to Stay program after both she, a child caretaker, and her husband, a chef, lost income during the pandemic. During the course of the program, Angela and her husband got the support needed to return to stable employment, and were connected to rental assistance and benefit programs to fill gaps along the way. No longer at risk of eviction, Angela is now enrolled in courses to advance her childcare certification and has worked with a Here to Stay financial coach to raise her credit score and purchase a car for their family of five.



Shadonna's Story

Shadonna is a Fox Grove Management resident and a part of one of the households affected by the Old Frenchtown Townhomes fire in 2020. She was able to quickly recover her life and belongings through strong family ties, determination, and the assistance of Fox Grove Managers and DeSales Community Services Coordination. She now continues her career assisting St. Louis youth and aspires for a new chapter in her life as a homeowner.

Latasha's Story

A busy mother and IT professional, Latasha had plenty on her plate before the pandemic. As COVID-19 began to spread, she also found herself in the midst of managing a childhood illness. The Here to Stay program was a huge help to alleviate financial stress. Through Community Services Coordination, Latasha was connected to comprehensive resources that helped her get back on track towards financial stability. She's now planning a career step-up into cybersecurity, and continues to enjoy her life in South St. Louis.



SouthSide Rec Youth Program

What is SouthSide Rec?

The SouthSide Rec (SSR) Youth
Program is a free to low-cost program
for kids of all ages that provides
recreational and enrichment
opportunities. Since 2016, SSR has
provided programming to the Fox Park
and Tower Grove East neighborhoods.
SSR is not only a product of DeSales'
desire to provide accessible and free
outlets for children in the community,
but also an example of DeSales'
initiatives to form ongoing connections
with a variety of community groups and
members.

Adjusting to 2020

With the outbreak of Covid-19, it was necessary for SSR to modify programming content and distribution. Partnerships stayed intact by making practical adjustments to regular programming: virtual art classes and take-home art bags were created for kids, free meals were distributed through curbside pick-up in the summer and fall, and cooking classes were streamed online with digital gift cards given to participants to purchase groceries for the classes from Schnucks.

Through partnerships with organizations such as Artscope and Operation Food Search, SSR has been able to grow its services beyond fitness activities and sports leagues. SSR connects children and families to opportunities to be active, explore the arts, and interact with local peers.

Engaging with the Community



Cultivating Informed Citizens

Many residents in the communities which DeSales serves are historically undercounted in census data, leading to negative and lasting consequences. Recognizing this, DeSales made a concerted effort to ensure that our residents and renters were given every opportunity to be counted in the 2020 Census. We actively collaborated with the Census Community Engagement staff, the League of Women Voters, and our own property management team to provide promotional materials, info sessions (both virtual and in-person), and mass communications encouraging our residents to join the count.

DeSales, Fox Grove and the League of Women Voters joined forces again to distribute non-partisan voting information to register new voters for the 2020 election.

Fox Park Field House Project

DeSales is working to renovate and redesign the Fox Park Field House, which is currently used for park storage. Our vision is to restore the building to its past functional glory while transforming its purpose to a community-reflective space and physical hub for SouthSide Rec. Virtual ASL Course



In response to the need for virtual community programming, DeSales coordinated an American Sign Language (ASL) course for all ages and skill levels. The instructor was Deaf, and the class used student interpreters from St. Louis Community College and Southwestern Illinois College. After 6-weeks, students could sign the alphabet, sign numbers 1-50, introduce themselves, and provide basic personal information. The success of and strong demand for the class led to a request for it to continue into 2021.

Community Garden

DeSales Community Garden provided opportunities for much-needed community connection and camaraderie in a year of social distancing. The garden added fruit trees and received a Gateway Greening Expansion Grant to replace old garden beds and add a new compost system. Plans were laid for the youth gardening program in 2021.
